

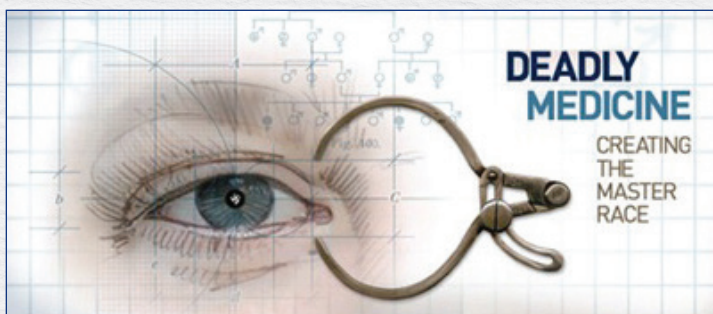

International Holocaust Remembrance Day



Each year, the Ghetto Fighters' House Museum commemorates International Holocaust Remembrance Day by examining topics that deal with the warning signs of discrimination and racism prior to WWII or other subjects that force us to examine humanity and universalism.

This year on International Holocaust Remembrance Day, we will open the traveling exhibit:

Deadly Medicine: Creating the Master Race, from the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. The exhibit traces the history from the early 20th-century international eugenics movement to the Nazi regime's "science of race." It also challenges viewers to reflect on the present-day interest in genetic manipulation that promotes the possibility of human perfection.
